

Forest Rules

A summary of rules is provided below as a convenience to forest visitors and is not intended to cover all laws and regulations. Please obey these rules so Pike State Forest can remain a beautiful area providing all forest users a quality backcountry experience.

Pike State Forest is open daily to visitors between the hours of 6 a.m. and 11 p.m. Legal campers, hunters, and anglers may be present during other hours.

Trails—Horses may be ridden only along forest roads or on designated trails. Most trails are designated as multi-use and are available to hikers and horses. **Designated bridle trails are marked with white blazes.** Numbered location markers are located at all road crossings and trail intersections. Find the corresponding location number on the map to determine your location.

Alcohol—Public display or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

Litter may be disposed of only in receptacles provided.

Disturbance, defacement, or destruction of any structure, property, natural feature, tree, shrub, or wildflower is prohibited.


Operation of motor vehicles is restricted to designated roads. The speed limit on all forest roads is 30 MPH unless otherwise posted. Vehicles may not be parked where traffic or access to service roads or trails will be obstructed.

Camping is permitted only in areas provided and designated for such use.

Fires are not permitted except in grills or fire rings provided. Fires must be attended at all times.


